

All examination papers that fall into the borderline categories after being marked by one of the Institute Examiners are then sent to an Institute Assessor for a further review of marking. The mark you receive in your results letter is the mark given by both Examiner and Assessor.

## Post Exam Review

The Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers post review process provides students with positive feedback aimed at guiding them towards better performance in their exams. The strengths and weaknesses of the paper are identified and remarks made with specific focus on how the student can achieve a higher mark on the next attempt. Exam reviews were here to help close the gap between the student's current results and how to improve for future exams. Feedback to students may also include general statements on structure, style, exam technique and strategy.

## The main functions of the review report are to:

1. identify students errors;
2. develop a clear understanding through explanation;
3. promote the development of good exams skills by focusing on the evidence of the use of effective exam technique and strategy skills as well as on the content.

We must receive your review request before 10<sup>th</sup> September 2015. The review reports will usually be available for students from early October 2015.
